**PROCLAIMING OCTOBER 2010 AS CYBER SECURITY AWARENESS MONTH
IN SACRAMENTO COUNTY**

WHEREAS, the County of Sacramento recognizes the vital role technology has in our daily lives and in the future of our State and Nation, whereby many citizens, businesses and other organizations use the Internet for a variety of personal, educational and business tasks; and

WHEREAS, the County has critical sectors that are increasingly reliant upon information systems to support financial services, energy, telecommunications, transportation, utilities, health care, and emergency response systems; and

WHEREAS, the County has been nationally recognized for its e-government efforts, and has won numerous awards, including landing in the top ten again this year in the Center for Digital Government’s annual Digital Counties Survey; and

WHEREAS, Internet users and our information infrastructure face an increasing threat of malicious cyber attack, loss of privacy from spyware and adware and significant financial and personal privacy losses due to identity theft and fraud; and

WHEREAS, Sacramento County is the California local government representative in the Multi-State Information Sharing and Analysis Center (MS-ISAC) which provides a mechanism to help state and local governments enhance cyber security; and Sacramento County’s Office of Communications and Information Technology provides a comprehensive approach to enhance the County’s security; and

WHEREAS, maintaining the security of cyberspace is a shared responsibility in which each of us has a critical role and awareness of computer security essentials to improve the security of Sacramento County information infrastructure and economy; and

WHEREAS, the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (www.us-cert.gov), the Multi-State Information Sharing and Analysis Center (www.msisac.org), the National Cyber Security Alliance (www.staysafeonline.org) and the National Association of State Chief Information Officers, (www.nascio.org) have declared October as National Cyber Security Awareness Month; and all county employees and citizens are encouraged to visit these sites to learn about cyber security and put that knowledge into practice in their homes, schools, workplaces and businesses.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AND ORDERED by the Chair of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Sacramento that the Board does hereby proclaim the month of October 2010 as **Cyber Security Awareness Month** in the County of Sacramento.
